Theatre Troupe is...


...a theatre-arts organisation that works with young people in the UK, who have experienced adverse childhood experiences, and have acute and complex mental health problems as a result. It is our mission to reach children and families who have been marginalised in multiple aspects of their lives to demonstrate the power that theatre -in all its art forms - has in changing lives.

When children join us, they become a member of a "troupe," a theatre family that works together to make a show, through performance, creative writing, design, music and more. Each child works alongside their own volunteer mentor, and through creating artistic work and having an emotional outlet, can heal and move on to brighter futures. We know it works, because our method - The Theatre Troupe Model - has been honed through a doctoral research project, offering a tried and tested way to reduce distress in those that are cut off from society.

- We offer **community projects.** Most recently we have delivered East London Youth Troupe and Southwark Youth Troupe for 7-11 year olds.
- We offer **bespoke projects in schools and other settings**, working with children in our communities. This has included schools, hospitals and in the family home.
- We lead the field in **volunteering practice** through our one-to-one mentoring initiative. We've worked with hundreds of volunteers of all ages, from a wide range of backgrounds. Many volunteers work with us for years and we have a strong track-record in employing our past volunteers and having them represented on our board.
- We have a specialist methodology the Theatre Troupe Model which was developed through PhD research. We teach our method in university settings, including a MSc. module based at Queen Mary University London, now in its sixth year. We have also taught the model in the University of East London, De Montfort University, Royal Central School of Speech & Drama and Goldsmiths College.

Our high level of support, which includes a therapist, food, transport, and one-to-one mentoring, means young people are steered towards us when other interventions don't fit: because face-to-face therapy isn't working; they're on waiting lists with deteriorating health; or they can't access community activities because they need one-to-one support or can't travel alone.

Through our standardised Theory of Change (evaluation method), we have shown the impact of our work in reducing distress, increasing confidence and building safe relationships, with high praise from young people, parents/carers and the professionals that refer them.



About the role

East London Youth Troupe (ELYT) and South London Youth Troupe (SLYT) are Theatre Troupe's flagship programmes. They run for 7-12 year olds although it is our intention to introduce continuation programmes for children aged 13-18. Each group consists of up to 18 children who live, are educated or access services in the London Boroughs of Tower Hamlets and Southwark, all of whom have significant emotional distress as a result of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs). This includes: family and community abuse and neglect, bullying, domestic violence, conflict and displacement (migrants, refugees and asylum seekers), and severe poverty, including coping inadequate living environments

Volunteers are the life blood of Theatre Troupe. Our specialist methodology - the Theatre Troupe Model - established the essential component of volunteers which underpins everything we do. Most volunteers are one-to-one mentors, but we also have our "chorus", who work across the project in a range of ways. Our volunteer programme is highly successful, and transformative for both children and volunteers alike. Many volunteers go on to pursue careers or further training in education and health settings as a result of their engagement with Theatre Troupe.

Up to now, we have been recruiting volunteers on a project-by-project basis, but as we upscale and reach more young people, there is a requirement to build and implement a rolling programme, with a central application process. The Volunteer Coordinator is key to developing and maintaining this. We are especially looking for a volunteer system that engages longer-term volunteers as well as shorter-term placements. This is particularly critical as our method has attachment theory at its heart.

Practical details

Timescale of contract: November 2025-December 2026

Fee: £8680 (14 hours a week for 40 weeks to be spread across the period, as mutually agreed between Theatre Troupe and the post holder).

Reporting to: Artistic Director

- ELYT will take place after-school on Wednesdays from mid-January-December 2026. Activities are at Queen Mary University London's Mile End Campus.
- South London Youth Troupe (SLYT) will take place after school on **Mondays or Thursdays** from April 2026. Activities are planned to take place in Southwark Playhouse Elephant
- The post requires attendance at some training and early workshop sessions, but much of the role on Wednesdays/Thursdays or Mondays can be remote. Other hours can be flexible as agreed between Theatre Troupe and the post-holder.

About the role (continued)

Roles & Responsibilities

Recruitment

Duties include:

- Ensuring there are enough high quality volunteers for ELYT and SLYT throughout each year
- Developing a rolling timeline for volunteer recruitments
- Building a bank of organisations and initiatives in order to recruit volunteers
- Design a marketing strategy to promote the benefit of volunteering for Theatre Troupe through recruitment drives, social media, press campaigns, and other profile-raising activities
- With the Artistic Director, engage in the volunteer application and shortlisting process

Management:

The post-holder will be responsible for volunteers attending and participating in the workshop programmes. This includes:

- · Providing volunteers with all necessary information required to work on projects
- Arranging travel routes for mentors' door-to-door travel with children
- · Ensuring schools and parents are conversant with travel arrangements
- Communicating on the day changes regarding mentors, participants and travel arrangements
- · Weekly promote volunteer activities, achievements and voices through social media

Safeguarding and Training

Duties include:

- · Ensuring volunteers are up to date with and adhere to Theatre Troupe's policies and best practice
- · Undertake DBS processes for new volunteers
- Arrange volunteer attendance for training sessions and external online training
- · With the Artistic Director, managing safeguarding disclosures and incidents where volunteers are reporting

Administration

- Developing and managing a volunteer database
- Keeping good records of volunteer activity including engagement and attendance
- Supporting the collection of volunteer feedback and evaluation
